



Tawas Food Backpack Program

I am reaching out with hopes that you will again join other individuals and businesses in our community in supporting the Tawas Food Backpack Program. This program provides for children each school year who depend on school breakfast and lunch programs, but are at risk of having little, if any access to nutritional foods over the weekend through no fault of their own.

The past 15 years of this program have been a success thanks to the generosity and care in our community for the children in need. Over the years we have served anywhere from 85 to 192 children each school year.

Every dollar you donate provides food for Tawas Area Students at risk of not having enough, if any food over the weekends. The program provides two Breakfasts,

two Lunches and two Dinners for each child.

The cost for each child is \$100.00 for the entire school year.

Donations of any amount are welcome.

This program is not federally funded and therefore must rely on the generosity of our local businesses, service organizations and individuals who believe in our mission.

The Tawas Food Backpack Program is our community working together to support our children in need.
